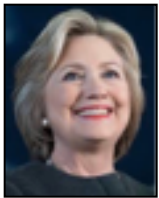

A Word About The Print Voters Guide

By 2008, the Fairfield League could count on The Minuteman, The Citizen-News, and the Sun to provide free League-organized pull-out Voters Guides plus 1,000 extra copies, gratis, for distribution around town. By 2015, challenged by steadily growing competition from online news services, the Papers' public-service budgets began to dry up. Steadily each paper gave up its tradition of printing the free pull-out section, though some posted the Voters' Guide on their Websites.

With the 2015 edition--and continuing today--the League pays for the 18,000

issue run of the Voters' Guide in The Fairfield Minuteman- \$1,500 in 2015 and \$1,600 this year!

We feel strongly that the print edition of the Guide continues to be 'out there', but we are also under increasing strain to fund the effort- largely from our own pockets, out of membership dues.
